



#### April 12 – Potters Field

In 1897, York City exhumed over 600 bodies from West College Avenue, moving them to their new location. Their final resting place would be the Potter's Field in North York Borough. Close to 200 more people have been interred there since with the last known burial taking place in 2004. There is only one headstone with one name: Clashay Johnson – a toddler killed by his mother. In this presentation Jamie Noerpel will dive into the history of York's City Cemetery with a focus on the people whose names were previously forgotten like P.T. Barnum's Figi Cannibal and a previously enslaved person named Squire Braxton.

#### April 19 – The Milton Hershey School

Milton Hershey School, founded in 1909, began as a dream and vision shared by chocolate magnate Milton S. Hershey and his wife, Catherine. The Hershey's loved children but were unable to have their own. Instead, they decided to use their wealth to create a home and school for orphaned boys. The Hershey's original idea for a school has evolved to meet the changing needs of lower-income families, including the creation of Catherine Hershey School for Early Learning in 2020. Come learn about the history and legacy Milton Hershey School continues to have on the community.

WWII affected families and communities worldwide, including right here in York County. Come learn about how local manufacturing worked together and changed their operations to support the war effort.

#### May 10 – Hahn Home

In 1913, Anna L. Gardner bequeathed her estate to create the Hahn Home, a place where elderly women, who no longer had the means to support themselves, could live out their years in dignity. After a fire badly damaged the building and the Hahn Home Board of Directors decided to sell the building, Al Kuhner, of Kuhner Associates Funeral Directors, purchased the building in 2004. Come learn about the history and legacy of this historical building. Kelly Drive resident Winnie Fickes, former Hahn Home Director, will also be available to answer resident questions following the program.

Before the attack on Pearl Harbor, young nurses enjoyed a peaceful working environment in paradise. This talk focuses on how the army and navy nurses worked at their duty stations on December 7, 1941 and then continues to tell the accomplishments these women made in the military and in their civilian careers. This program is told by Winnie Woll, daughter of Teresa Stauffer Foster, an Army nurse stationed at the Tripler Army Hospital on Oahu, Hawaii at the time of the attack.





Due to Gutenberg spread of Protestantism, Mendelssohn used text from biblical scripture on a journey of suspense and hope.
