They were made in the style of miners who had worked in the area, complete with red hats and wheelbarrows. At the height of production, Griebel's factory made approximately 300 different gnomes.

Gnomes have even made their way into pop culture. From fantasy novels to animated films, they are often depicted as mischievous yet wise creatures. Some travelers even participate in "gnome-napping" pranks, where a garden gnome is taken on an adventure and returned with photos from its journey.

Beyond their playful reputation, gnomes bring a sense of personality to gardens. Whether tucked among flowers or standing guard by a vegetable patch, they add a touch of fun to outdoor spaces. Many gardeners believe gnomes bring good luck, helping plants thrive and flourish.
